



## Cool things to do when you visit WildSpring

There are so many interesting places you can explore, beautiful sights to admire and interesting things to do while you're here. Here are a few (click on the little spiral to link to a site page for more information):

Have a massage in your own cabin. 

Share our walking labyrinth with the family of deer that likes to nibble on its clover.

Visit Port Orford's very cool art galleries - there are eight! 

Go to Cape Blanco State Park and the Lighthouse - the most westerly point in the 48 states. 

*(Note: considering it's the most westerly point in the 48 states and it's up on a bluff, it's conceivable that if you were there at sunset, you could be the last person in the 48 states to see the sun go down!)*

Don't miss Hughes House, an authentically restored Victorian mansion. 

Go to the Port of Port Orford and see our dolly dock – one of 6 in the world. 

Visit Port Orford Heads and Lifeboat Station Museum. 

Search for agates and driftwood on Agate Beach (please be very careful of sneaker waves!) 

Sit at Battle Rock Park and be awed by the view at Port Orford Bay. 

Walk our uncrowded beaches with extra-fine sand the color of a mocha latte. 

Use our bikes and go on a picnic.

Visit Art 101 about 20 miles north to see huge sculptures made from beach debris. 

Climb Humbug Mountain. 

See a movie in the Savoy Theater with its comfy seats and rockin' collection of candy.

Visit Port Orford's Wetland Interpretive Walkway, north end of town. 

Surf! 

Birding. 

Play golf! 

Go fishing. 

Rent a kayak, windsurfing and kiteboarding gear. 

Get lessons on windsurfing and kite surfing at Floras Lake. 

Visit our new library and enjoy its many events.

Visit the redwoods (a little over an hour south in the Jedediah State Park. Plus the northern-most redwood grove in the US can be reached by a  $\frac{3}{4}$ -mile self-guided trail only 50 miles south of here in the Alfred Loeb State Park)!!!

Finally...for whatever reason...drive south to Brookings. That 60 miles is arguably the most beautiful stretch of the Pacific coast in the U.S. There are all sorts of viewpoints on the way, and look for Natural Bridge about 7 miles north of Brookings - it's a little nondescript parking lot. Just walk the short trail through the canopy of trees to the end. It's gorgeous.
